ORDINANCE NO. 474

ORDINANCE FOR REFERENDUM ELECTION

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Nokomis, Montgomery County, Illinois, that:

SECTION I: There shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Nokomis, Illinois, at a Special Election, which is hereby called to be held in and for said City on the 17 day of November, A.D. 1959, the following proposition:

"Shall Ordinance No. 471, providing for a street lighting agreement between the City of Nokomis, Illinois, and the Central Illinois Public Service Company, its successors and assigns, whereby the Central Illinois Public Service Company agrees to furnish the City of Nokomis, within its corporate limits and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in said agreement, street lighting service from one hundred ninety one (191) electric lamps, said one hundred ninety one (191) electric lamps being of the following respective lumen ratings and burning periods:

Class A: 151 lamps of 2500 lumens burning from dusk until dawn every night

Class B: 12 color improved mercury vapor lamps of 23,000 lumens, supported by wood poles and burning from dusk until dawn every night

Class C: 28 color improved mercury vapor lamps of 23,000 lumens, supported on ornamental steel poles and burning from dusk until dawn every night

for which said service from said one hundred ninety one (191) electric lamps the City of Nokomis agrees to pay the Central Illinois Public Service Company the sum of Forty Nine Thousand Fifty Nine and 60/100 (\$49,059.60) Dollars payable during the period of said agreement in one hundred twenty (120) monthly installments of Four Hundred Eight and 83/100 (\$408.83) Dollars each, each installment to be paid on or before the 15th day of the month next succeeding that in which the service was rendered, be adopted?

The said proposition as described in this Section shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Nokomis, Montgomery County, Illinois, at a special election to be held on the 17 day of November, A.D. 1959.

SECTION II: Notice of said election shall be published in the Free

Press Progress, a newspaper of general circulation in said City, said publication to be not more than thirty nor less than fifteen days prior to the date of said election, and that said notice shall be in substantially the following form:

Public Notice is hereby given that on the 17 day of November, A.D. 1959, a Special Election will be held in and for the City of Nokomis, Montgomery County, Illinois, at which election there will be submitted to the voters of said City the following proposition:

" Shall Ordinance No. 471, providing for a street lighting agreement between the City of Nokomis, Illinois, and the Central Illinois Public Service Company, its successors and assigns, whereby the Central Illinois Public Service Company agrees to furnish the City of Nokomis, within its corporate limits and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in said agreement, street lighting service from one hundred ninety one (191) electric lamps, said one hundred ninety one (191) electric lamps being of the following respective lumen ratings and burning periods:

Class A: 151 lamps of 2500 lumens burning from dusk until dawn every night

Class B: 12 color improved mercury vapor lamps of 23,000 lumens, supported by wood poles and burning from dusk until dawn every night

Class C: 28 color improved mercury vapor lamps of 23,000 lumens, supported on ornamental steel poles and burning from dusk until dawn every night

for which said service from said one hundred ninety one (191) electric lamps the City of Nokomis agrees to pay the Central Illinois Public Service Company the sum of Forty Nine Thousand Fifty Nine and 60/100 (\$49,059.60) Dollars payable during the period of said agreement in one hundred twenty (120) monthly installments of Four Hundred Eight and 83/100 (\$408.83) Dollars each, each installment to be paid on or before the 15th day of the month next succeeding that in which the service was rendered, be adopted?

The polling place for such election shall be:

City Hall of the City of Nokomis, Illinois

The polls shall be open from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M. C. S. T.

SECTION III: The form of ballot to be used at said election shall be substantially as follows:

<p>for which said service from said one hundred ninety one (191) electric lamps the City of Nokomis agrees to pay the Central Illinois Public Service Company the sum of Forty Nine Thousand Fifty Nine and 60/100 (\$49,059.60) Dollars payable during the period of said agreement in one hundred twenty (120) monthly installments of Four Hundred Eight and 83/100 (\$408.83) Dollars each, each installment to be paid on or before the 15th day of the month next succeeding that in which the service was rendered, be adopted?</p>	NO	

SECTION IV: For the purpose of such election, the following shall be the precincts and polling places:

City Hall, Nokomis, Illinois

SECTION V: The judges shall be such as shall be hereafter designated by the City Council to serve as election officials.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage

and approval as provided by law.
