

ANNUAL TAX LEVY ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING

ON THE 30th DAY OF APRIL, A.D. 1964

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Nokomis, did on the 1st day of July, 1963, pass the annual appropriation ordinance for said City for the fiscal year ending on the 30th day of April, A.D. 1964, in the aggregate sum of One Hundred One Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$101,300.00), which said ordinance was duly published in the Free Press Progress, the official newspaper of said City of Nokomis on the 4th day of July, 1963, and now in full force and effect and on file with the City Clerk, and,

WHEREAS, the City Council having ascertained the total amount of appropriations legally made for all corporate purposes to be provided for by the tax levy of the current fiscal year;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Nokomis, Illinois:

SECTION I

That there be and there is hereby levied upon all property subject to taxation, both real and personal, within the corporate limits of the City of Nokomis, Illinois as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes, for the fiscal year ending on the 30th day of April, A.D. 1964, the total sum of Ninety Nine Thousand Three Hundred Ten and no/100 Dollars (\$99,310.00) and the following specific purposes mentioned in said appropriation ordinance and in the respective sums as follows, the total amount of appropriations being detailed under the column headed "Amount Appropriated" and the total amount levied being detailed under the column headed "Amount Levied", as follows, to wit:

SECTION II

The City Clerk of the City of Nokomis, is hereby authorized and directed to promptly file a proper certified copy of this tax levy ordinance with the County Clerk of Montgomery County, Illinois, and the said County Clerk is hereby directed and requested to ascertain the rate per cent upon total valuation of all property subject to taxation within the said City, as that property is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes, will produce a net amount payable to the City of Nokomis of not less than the amount so levied, and to extend such tax on the book or books for the collector of taxes and cause said tax to be collected in the manner required by Statute.

SECTION III

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect, from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.
