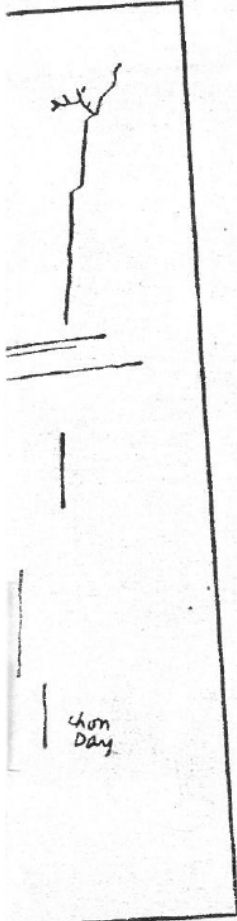

**ORDINANCE NO. 520
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING
A CURFEW FOR CERTAIN
CHILDREN IN THE CITY OF
NOKOMIS, MONTGOMERY
COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Nokomis, Montgomery County, Illinois, that:

SECTION I. It is hereby made unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen (18) years of age to be, or remain in or upon any of the streets, alleys, or public places in the City of Nokomis during the following period of time:

- (a) Between 12:01 A. M. and 6:00 A. M. Saturday;
- (b) Between 12:01 A. M. and 6:00 A. M. Sunday; and
- (c) Between 11:00 P. M. on Sunday to Thursday, inclusive, and 6:00 A. M. on the following day, unless such person is accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person at least twenty one (21) years of age having the legal custody of such minor person or who is in performance of an errand or duty directed by such parent, guardian, or other person having the care or custody of such minor person, or whose employment makes it necessary to be upon said streets, alleys, or public places during the night time after said specified hours. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction, be fined in any sum not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense and stand committed until such fine and costs are paid.

SECTION II. It is hereby made unlawful for any person, guardian, or other person having the legal care and custody of any person under eighteen (18) years of age, to allow or permit any such child, ward or other person under age, while in such legal custody, to go or be in or upon any of the streets, alleys, or public places in said city within the time prohibited in Section I of this ordinance, unless there exists a reasonable necessity therefor. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall, on conviction be fined in any sum not

less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense and stand committed until such fines and costs are paid.

SECTION III. It shall be the duty of the police officer on duty during said above time to see that a curfew bell is rung each and every evening and morning at the beginning and end of the above specified periods of time.

SECTION IV. Passed at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Nokomis, Montgomery County, Illinois, held at the City Hall in said City on September 16, 1963.
