

ORDINANCE NO. 602

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE TRANSPORTATION, CARRYING OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR IN OR ABOUT OR UPON ANY MOTOR VEHICLE IN THE CITY OF NOKOMIS, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NOKOMIS, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I

That it shall be unlawful for any person to transport, carry, possess or have any alcoholic liquor in or about or upon any motor vehicle in the City of Nokomis, Illinois, except in the original package with the seal unbroken.

SECTION II

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than Seventy Five Dollars (\$75.00) nor more than One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) for each violation thereof.

SECTION III

Any ordinance or ordinances of said City of Nokomis now in conflict with this ordinance is hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION IV

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
