ORDINANCE NO. 686

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A LICENSE AGREEMENT FOR WIRE, PIPE AND CABLE TRANSVERSE CROSSINGS AND LONGITUDINAL OCCUPATIONS BETWEEN THE CITY OF NOKOMIS, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, ILLINOIS and CONSOLIDATED RAIL CORPORATION, a Pennsylvania Corporation.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NOKOMIS, MONTGOMERY COUNTY,

SECTION I. That a license agreement for wire, pipe and cable transverse crossings and longitudinal occupations between the City of Nokomis, Montgomery County, Illinois, and Consolidated Rail Corporation, a Pennsylvania Corporation, be entered into, executed and adopted by the City of Nokomis, Montgomery County, Illinois and Consolidated Rail Corporation, a Pennsylvania Corporation. A copy of said agreement is attached hereto marked Exhibit A and made of part of this Ordinance.

SECTION II. That the Mayor of the City of Nokomis is hereby authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the said City of Nokomis and the City Clerk of the City of Nokomis is hereby authorized to attest the execution of said agreement and the seal of the City of Nokomis be affixed thereto.
