

ORDINANCE NO. 750

ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Section 39s-1 through 39s-12, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes 1973, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the City Council of the City of Nokomis investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said City employed in performing construction of public works, for said City exclusive of maintenance work.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NOKOMIS, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City of Nokomis is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Montgomery County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 1985, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the City of Nokomis to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The City of Nokomis Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this City this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4: The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The City Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

 PREVAILING WAGES FOR CONSTRUCTION TRADES

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THESE PREVAILING WAGES SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE ADVERTISED SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVERY CONTRACT TO WHICH ANY PUBLIC BODY, AS DEFINED IN CHAPTER 48, SECTION 395-2 ILL. REV. STAT., IS A PARTY. FOR CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION AND/OR REPAIR, INCLUDING PAINTING, REDECORATING AND LANDSCAPING OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS OR PUBLIC WORKS WITHIN THE STATE OF ILLINOIS WHICH REQUIRES OR INVOLVES THE EMPLOYMENT OF MECHANICS AND/OR LABORERS. MINIMUM WAGES, OVERTIME RATE AND FRINGE BENEFITS CERTIFIED HEREIN SHALL BE PAID AND THE SCALE OF WAGES TO BE PAID SHALL BE POSTED BY THE CONTRACTOR IN A PROMINENT AND EASILY ACCESSIBLE PLACE AT THE SITE OF WORK. THIS DETERMINATION IS THE PROPERTY OF THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND SHALL NOT BE ALTERED WITHOUT THEIR CONSENT IN WRITING.

TRUCK DRIVERS -- CLASSIFICATION OF EQUIPMENT - BUILDING, HEAVY & HIGHWAY WORK

Jurisdiction in the following Counties of Illinois:

Adams, Alexander, Bond, Brown, Bureau, Calhoun, Carroll (South), Cass, Champaign, Clark, Clay, Clinton, Coles, Crawford, Cumberland, De Witt, Douglas, Edgar, Edwards, Effingham, Fayette, Ford, Franklin, Fulton, Christian, Gallatin, Greene, Hamilton, Hancock, Hardin, Henderson, Henry, Iroquois- (Southeast), Jackson, Jasper, Jefferson, Jersey, Jo Daviess (West), Johnson, Knox, La Salle, Lawrence, Lee, Livingston (Northwest), Logan, McDonough, McLean, Macon, Macoupin, Madison, Marion, Marshall, Mason, Massac, Menard, Mercer, Monroe, Montgomery, Morgan, Moultrie, Ogle (South), Peoria, Perry, Piatt, Pike, Pope, Pulaski, Putnam, Randolph, Rock Island, Richland, St. Clair, Saline, Sangamon, Schuyler, Scott, Shelby, Stark, Tazewell, Union, Vermillion, Wabash, Warren, Washington, Wayne, White, Whiteside, Williamson and Woodford.

NAME OF TRUCK  
Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehousemen, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling material, tools, or men to and from and on the job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, and four axle combination units.

In the event the Employer desires to use ticket writers that classification shall come under Class 2.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, mechanics and working foremen.

Five axle or more combination units.

In the event the Employer desires to use dispatchers that classification shall come under Class 3.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

EXPLANATION OF OPERATING ENGINEERS CLASSES -  
BUILDING AND HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Jurisdiction in all of St. Clair, Madison, Macoupin, Bond, Clinton, Monroe, Washington, Marion, Jefferson, Perry, Calhoun, Randolph, Jersey, Montgomery, Fayette and Greene Counties. Randolph County includes Kaskaskia Island.

- Class 1. Cranes, Dragline, Shovels, Skimmer Scoops, Clamshells or Derrick Boats, Pile Drivers, Crane-Type Backhoes, Asphalt Plant Operators, Concrete Plant Operators, Ditching Machines or Backfillers (requiring Oilers), Dredges, Asphalt Spreading Machines, All Locomotives, Cable Ways, or Tower Machines, Hoists - 2 Drum or more (where Oiler or Fireman is required)...Hydraulic Backhoes, Ditching Machines or Backfiller (not requiring Oilers), Hoists - 2 Drums or more (where Oiler or Fireman is not required), Cherrypickers, Overhead Cranes, Roller, Steam or Gas, Concrete Pavers, Excavators, Concrete Breakers, Concrete Pumps, Bulk Cement Plants, Cement Pumps, Derrick-Type Drills, Mixers, (over three bags), Boat Operators (25 feet and over)...Motor Graders or Pushcats, Scoops or Tournapulls, Bulldozers, Endloaders or Fork Lifts, Power Blade or Elevating Graders, Winch Cats, Boom or Winch Trucks or Boom Tractors, Pipe Wrapping or Painting Machines. Asphalt Plant Engineer, Journeyman Lubricating Engineer, Self-Propelled walk-behind rollers...Drills (other than Derrick Type), One Drum Hoists, Mud Jacks, or Well Drilling Machines, Boring Machines or Track Jacks, Mixers (Two or Three Bags), Conveyors (Two), Air Compressors (Two), Water Pumps regardless of size (Two), Welding Machines (Two), Siphons or Jets (Two), Winch Heads or Apparatuses (Two), Light Plants (Two)...Mixers (under two bags)...All Tractors regardless of size (straight tractor only), Fireman on Stationary Boilers, Automatic Elevators, Form Grading Machines, Finishing Machines, Power Sub-Grader or Ribbon Machines, Longitudinal Floats, Boat Operators (under 25 feet), Distributor Operators on Trucks, Winch Heads or Apparatuses (One), Mobile track air and heaters (Two to Five), Assistant Master Mechanic and Heavy Duty Mechanic.
- Class 2. Air Compressors (One), Water Pumps, regardless of Size (One), Welding Machine (One), Mixers (One Bag), Conveyor (One), Siphon or Jet (One), Light Plant (One), Heater (One), Immobile Track Air (One).
- Class 3. Asphalt Spreader Oilers, Fireman on Whirlies.
- Class 4. Heavy Equipment Oilers (Truck Cranes, Dredges, Monigans, Large Cranes), over 65 ton rated capacity.
- Class 5. Oiler.
