Section 1: That all of the alleyway between Lots One (1), Two (2) and Three (3) and Lots Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15) and Sixteen (16) in Block Four (4) in Miller and Young's Second Addition to Nokomis, situated in the City of Nokomis, shall be, and is hereby, vacated to the owners of the land abutting thereon in accordance with Section 11-91-2 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-91-2), subject to reservations in any, and all, public utilities with rights of way or easements over, under or upon the tract vacated for continuing public service by means of those facilities and for the maintenance, renewal and reconstruction thereof.

Section 2: That the city clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this ordinance and the original of the publisher's certificate of publication giving due notice of this said meeting with the Montgomery County Recorder.
